ORDER GRANTING AGREED MOTION FOR DISMISSAL

This court having considered Plaintiff Francois Carrillo and Defendant Autobuses de Oriente ADO, S.A. de C.V.'s Agreed Motion for Dismissal under Rule 41(a)(2) of the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure, finds that the Motion is well taken and is **GRANTED**. In light of the Parties' agreement that (i) Plaintiff's interests in respect of the ado.com domain name are legitimate; (ii) Plaintiff did not register or use the ado.com domain name in bad faith; (iii) Plaintiff's registration and current use of the ado.com domain name do not violate Defendant's rights under the Anticybersquatting Consumer Protection Act, 15 U.S.C. §§ 1114, 1125(a) and 1125(d)

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that


1. All claims and counterclaims in this action are hereby dismissed with prejudice and each party is to bear its own costs and attorneys' fees;

2. The World Intellectual Property Organization (“WIPO”) shall vacate and/or withdraw its February 1, 2018 Order granting Plaintiff’s complaint and ordering the ado.com domain name transferred from Plaintiff to Defendant; and

3. TurnCommerce, Inc. DBA NameBright.com, the registrar for the a do.c om domain name and/or VeriSign, Inc. registry operator for the .com registry, shall remove any suspensions, locks, holds or other restrictions imposed upon the ado.com domain name as a result of the WIPO panel’s February 1, 2018 order.
